- To assist/advise the FIH Academy in developing FIH Academy resources for the purposes of helping National Associations and Continental Federations to develop their coaches, officials and management teams.
- To assist/advise on developing, tracking, maintaining and appointing FIH Academy Educators and education workforce
- To provide a support structure for the ongoing development of the FIH Academy workforce
- To provide opportunities high performance/elite coaches to regularly improve their skills and experience.

PROJECTS

FIH Year of the Youth 2021 – celebrating 20 years on from the 2001 year of the youth, a range of projects and initiatives were launched to encourage the growth and promotion of youth participation in hockey.

- FIH World Hockey Camps 2021 inaugural year of an ongoing project to recognise and promote high quality hockey camps which will also provide assisted places. In year one, Camps will be held in London, Amsterdam, Antwerp, Koksijde, Cardiff, Zurich and Philadelphia.
- Yoty2021 Projects A digital and print promotion pack was created and distributed to NAs with over 50 projects already registered. Projects have a regular slot on FIH media channels.
- Start:Play:Stay resources for schools and junior clubs are in production and will be available
 in 2021. These resources, including format and training guides for players, coaches,
 teachers, and officials, will then support delivery of participation growth projects in 2021
 and future years.
- Virtual Youth Conference will be held in 2021 with the aim of bringing together young people and adults working with young people. The conference will be launched on Olympic Day and will take place in September 2021.
- FIH World Youth Panel Planned revival of the Panel as an outcome of the Virtual Youth Conference.

NA Development – A series of seminars, workshops and resources have been created to support NA development, specifically in the areas of Gender Equality, Facilities, Event management, Sustainability and Development. The online series will take place on a 2-3 monthly basis.

Parahockey & Hockey5s – projects to support the growth of these two formats has also been a focus for 2020-21.

Education – FIH Academy Courses and Workshops.

- The DEC took the step to move the FIH Academy programme online in April 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic. To date, over 200 online workshops/sessions have been delivered to over 2500 individuals.
- In 2021 a full equivalency project will take place to analyse qualifications available in member nations in comparison with FIH Academy programmes.
