

President Election

1 position, 2 candidates

Scenario 1

Round 1

1 candidate gets absolute majority.
He is declared elected. Process is over

Scenario 2

Round 1

No candidate gets absolute majority.

Both candidates go to Round 2

Round 2

If one candidate gets absolute majority, he is declared elected and process is over.

If no one gets absolute majority, both candidates go to Round 3.

Round 3

Candidate with most votes is elected. Process is over.

If there is a tie, then following completion of all other elections the members of the Executive Board present at Congress shall select the winner by Simple Majority.

*Absolute Majority:

More than $\frac{1}{2}$ of those online (logged in to the Lumi voting system) at the time of the vote and entitled to vote including any abstentions or blanked or spoiled.

* Simple Majority :

More than $\frac{1}{2}$ of the votes validly cast, disregarding any abstentions or blanked or spoiled.

2 positions, 3 candidates

	<p>2 or more candidates get absolute majority. The 2 with the highest votes are declared elected. Process is over</p>		
Scenario 2	Round 1	Round 2	Round 3
	<p>1 candidate gets absolute majority. She is declared elected. The next 2 candidates go to Round 2.</p>	<p><u>In case of 2 candidates:</u> If one candidate gets absolute majority, she is declared elected and process is over. If no one gets absolute majority or there is a tie then there is a 3rd round of voting.</p>	<p><u>In case of 2 candidates:</u> Candidate with most votes is elected. Process is over. If there is a tie, then following completion of all other elections the members of the Executive Board present at Congress shall select the winner by Simple Majority.</p>
Scenario 3	Round 1		Round 2
	<p>No candidate gets absolute majority. The 2 candidates who came first and second in the first ballot go to Round 2. The candidate with least votes is eliminated.</p>		<p>The two remaining candidates will be approved by acclamation. (where there are 2 candidates for 2 positions, approval by acclamation based on art. 12.1 FIH Statutes)</p>

***Absolute Majority:**

More than ½ of those online (logged in to the Lumi voting system) at the time of the vote and entitled to vote including any abstentions or blanked or spoiled.

*** Simple Majority :**

More than ½ of the votes validly cast, disregarding any abstentions or blanked or spoiled.

EB Election Men

2 positions, 2 candidates

Scenario 1

Round 1

The two candidates will be approved by acclamation.

(where there are 2 candidates for 2 positions, approval by acclamation based on art. 12.1 FIH Statutes)

***Absolute Majority:**

More than $\frac{1}{2}$ of those online (logged in to the Lumi voting system) at the time of the vote and entitled to vote including any abstentions or blanked or spoiled.

*** Simple Majority :**

More than $\frac{1}{2}$ of the votes validly cast, disregarding any abstentions or blanked or spoiled.
